We are instructed by Mr. W.J. McEvoy of No. 313 Ngh. Circular Road, to make a claim in respect of the occupation of his residence by the Military Authorities.

On Easter Monday, Mr. McEvoy left his house, in which was his wife, who is in a dying condition, and a young family.

On his return that evening he found it in the occupation of the Insurgents. He managed to get his family out of the house, and since then and at the present moment the house is in the occupation of the Military Authorities. Damage has been done to the Building to the extent of £151:0:0 and to the furniture and contents to the extent of £171:0:6.

On Wednesday May the 17th we again examined the above premises which we found as before in indescribable confusion and suffering greatly from wear and tear and rough usage. Our previous Valuation for £129 did not cover a lot of minor household goods which did not then come under our observation, the remains of which are now discernable here and there. Our valuation on this date of the furniture and effects which can be reasonably taken over having regard to our valuation of May 11th is 2102. 15. 0, which shows a deficit of 226. 5. 6 and taking fairly into account the cost of cleaning the house which is in a filthy condition, also cleaning the bedding, curtains, furniture etc, and the 1 loss of minor effects such as are the complement of every occupied house. We are of opinion that Mr McEvoy is certainly entitled to a further sum of £25 to recoup him and restore the house as regards the furnishing to its normal condition making a total of such loss sustained 251. 5. 6. Fifty one pounds five shillings & sixpence Stg.
