I had an interview with the Applicant herein. She is most respectable; both she and her late husband have been in the employment of above Firm for many years. The claim at first seemed to be somewhat unaccountable but I have ascertained that the unfortunate woman - who had only buried her husband a few days previously - had to abandon her home to the Military for several days. I may here mention that the premises (Barringtons) were suitable for the necessary Military operations. The heavy furniture was lost or damaged through being used for barricading purposes and all the lighter stuff was missing when the Claimant was permitted to return to her home. The Applicant, I understand, was assisted by her Employers to draft her claim, and on checking over the items most carefully, I have come to the conclusion that the claim is reasonably stated and is genuine. I recommend therefore that the claim be paid in full.
