Dear Sir,

We propose to supply and hang new door to Lavatory and fix new lock on outer door, to cut out present damaged stile of door frame, supply new red deal $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x 3" rebated and chamfered stile and fix in position with new spud at bottom fixed in sill, repair plastering damaged by this work, rehang door, refix striking plate of lock and paint new woodwork three coats. Paint both sides of two new doors three coats best oil paint, grain as before and varnish one coat best hard carriage varnish, for the sum of Five pounds fifteen shillings and six pence stg. (£5 : 15 : 6)

Repair back roof where pointed out, supplying twelve slates 16" x 8", twelve slates 24" x 12" and eight large ton slates, supplying one length of 5" H.R. gutter and joint in position, in place of broken length, slip sundry cracked slates with zinc and clean out gutters. Repair about 4 yards of ceiling where fallen, for the sum of Four pounds eighteen shillings stg. (£4 18 : 0)
