Dear Sir,

We are acting for Mr. George Henry Pentland of Black Hall, Drogheda, who is the owner in fee simple of Nos. 18,19 and 20 and Nos. 24, 25,26 and 27 Henry Street all of which have been destroyed.

Mr. Pentland would not have any claim provided the buildings are re-instated and rent due him pending rebuilding duly pay to him.

If you have any form of claim suitable a case of this kind we shall be obliged by your sending us same or stating in what way his claim should be prepared.

The rents amount to about £1,200 per annum and if it would be of assistance to the Commission we can furnish you with a statement showing the yearly rent in each case and the terms of the lease under which each tenant holds and the amount of fire insurance provided for in the lease.
