Referring to recent correspondence regarding the missing Debenture, I have had an exhaustive search made in the Archives of the Company with the object if possible of discovering a duplicate copy of the Bond. Unfortunately I have been unsuccessful. It is now 17 years since the Debentures were issued and after this lapse of time it is not possible to state if there are any in existence, but I think not.

I have obtained the loan of a Debenture from another holder and put the matter before our Printers, who state that it will be necessary to take a photograph of the Bond and take a copy from the stone. The cost of this is estimated to be about 35/- to 40/- in addition to which the stamp duty will be 3/9. If you will be good enough to remit sufficient to cover the cost of reproduction I will have the work put in hand at once and let you have the new Bond when ready.




