

Dear Sir,

I received your memo re above. It is utterly impossible to give detailed particulars of the stock consumed or taken away by the Military, who were in possession of Claimant's premises from the 28th of April to the 2nd of May. You will see by referring to the Declaration of the Claimant that one of her assistants and a man of the name of Healy was shot and both buried in the cellar underneath her premises.

No money could compensate the Claimant for the loss she has sustained.
