## Claim for Damages caused during the Disturbances on the 24th April, 1916, and following days.

I William J. Butler now residing

at 34 Bachelors Walk in the City of Dublin

do hereby solemnly and sincerely declare that on or about the 24 day of April 1916, damage was done to the undermentioned Property, namely:—\*

a lady's 18 carat gold bangle & a gent's umbrella

and such damage was occasioned to the best of my belief by\*\* the military and rebels
