Mr Higginbotham has been with us today to see if possible whether a payment on account could be given in his case as he has lost everything in the world.

His fixtures and fittings which were insured for £ 200, shew a loss much in excess of that amount. His rent insured for 2 £250, which he pays annually, is a total loss. His Household Furniture, which was formerly insured for £300 but the policy on which had been allowed to lapse in error, was a total loss, and was insufficiently insured in the sum of £300.

If Mr Higginbotham could be allowed an immediate payment of £750, it would be some immediate relief to him, and we think his case requires immediate consideration for a payment on account.
