Claim for Damages caused during the Disturbances on the 24th April, 1916, and following days.

I We Margaret Gorey now residing at Newbridge in the ~~City~~ of Kildare do hereby solemnly and sincerely declare that on or about the 24<sup>th</sup> day of April 1916, damage was done to the undermentioned Property, namely:—\*

A figure clock and such damage was occasioned to the best of ~~my~~ belief by\*\* the out-break of riot in Dublin
