

> On receiving the pay order on the byth December last, I immadiately lodged a protest, against this in avaguacy of this award, with the Right Non: the Chief Leveland for Speland and was referred by him to your Commetter for reconsideration of the case. It appeared. to me from the bublished statements both of the lats Prims Winister and Home Secretary, that the Jonernment were prepared to accept hability up to the amount for which property was moved. My watch was insured by me as part of my honorhold furnitures and further insured by Messos Kopkins and Hopkins while in their Custary (as her their letter toms); so that, as far as I was Concerned, every precantion was taken to mdamnify

indamnify me against loss; and if the arcumstances of its loss or destructions were hormal, I would be fully compensated by the Insurance Companies concerned. In view of this fact I cannot understand why my claim was cut down 55%, with ont any reason being assigned or any oppositunity afforded into Of justifying my claim. I cannot understand the basis of compensation adopted by the Property and Losses Committle. I was not asked to furnish any wintence beyond that stated in my claim. Some inquiry was, homerer, made through the Police, but this hat no relation to the value of the article, and was in fact, worthless for any purposs. There hi my possession Mesors Hopkins and Hopkinis letter of the 5th of Capril egile giving the humber of the watch and the nature of the repairs necessary; and I have no doubt that, if required I could get particulars of its purchase by me from Mesons J. W. Renson Led. of Judgate Hill, London, but the price can he easily vouched to this pinio Catalogus which I have before ms. This watch could not now be reblaced for less than 35% above its original cost In view of the facts fat forth herein, I beg respectfully to submit my claim for the Kind lonsideration of your Committee.
