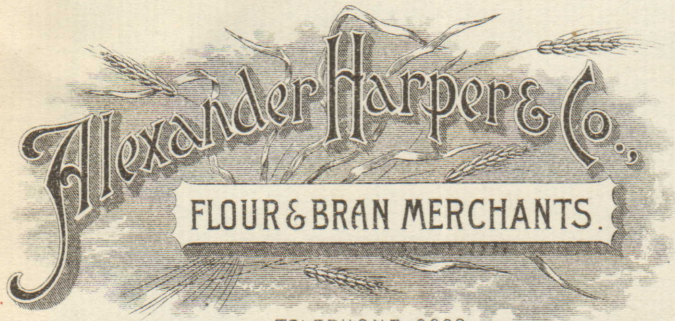

Interests in the buildings

I interviewed claimant + inspected his books + invoices. I also interviewed the Manager of Ledeastle Mc Cormick + Co. Ltd. and examined their Books which showed a loss of 22 barrels of Bran. Ledeastle are not responsible for goods lost or damaged in their stores. Messrs Hume + Co. dealt with the salvage of goods in Ledeastle stores.

I ascertained that claimant had a War + Marine Insurance on the stock lost but subsequently found that the liability of the Underwriters ceased on delivery of goods on Quay. (See letter 28/10/16 from North Shore Mill hereinafter)

There is a small reduction for selling Pure.

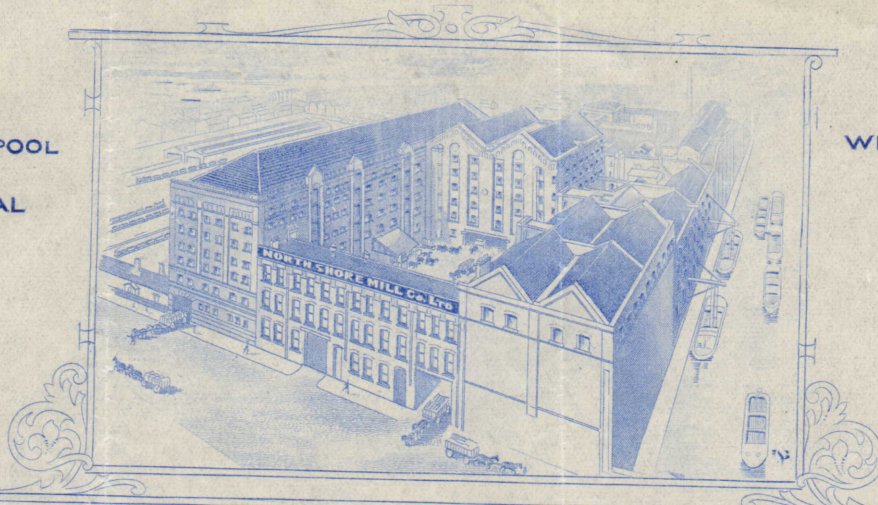
