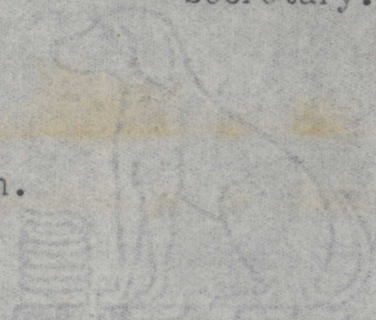
In reply to your letter of the 14th instant I beg to state that the Paying Order referred to (which is herewith returned) is in respect of your own watch.

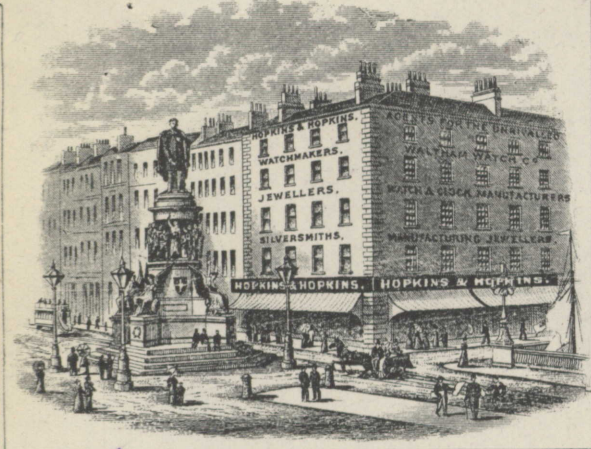

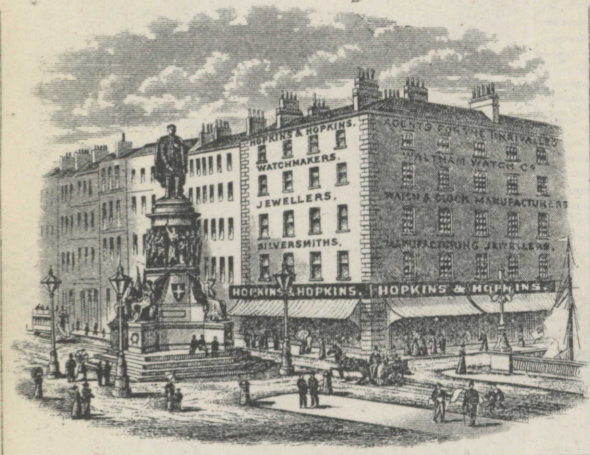
