

Mary's Abbey but she was unable to obtain particulars of same as the
business has been disposed of for some years to another party, she called
at Messrs Robinson, Sweent Merchants Capel Street for particulars of
orders given by her to them but they refused to look into their books for
same.

We may be able to obtain further particulars for you and if we do we shall forward same to you. We think account should be taken of the fact that our client looked after the business herself and paid cash for practically all the goods which were supplied to her and that it would be almost impossible to furnish detail information of the stock.
