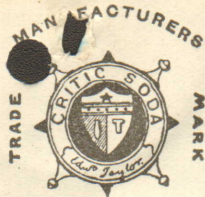




We enclose you some accounts which your client Mrs Hayes handed to us this evening the parties have all informed our client that they will give you all information possible. Our client informs us that if you require any information as to the stock etc Mrs Kearney 13 North King Street who is the owner of the premises and who was in same at least once each week can give you same.

Mrs Hayes gave an opening account to Messrs Brennan Chandlers Mary's Abbey but she was unable to obtain particulars of same as the business has been disposed of for some years to another party, she called at Messrs Robinson, Sweet Merchants Capel Street for particulars of orders given by her to them but they refused to look into their books for same.

We may be able to obtain further particulars for you and if we do we shall forward same to you. We think account should be taken of the fact that our client looked after the business herself and paid cash for practically all the goods which were supplied to her and that it would be almost impossible to furnish detail information of the stock.

We would suggest that an interview with our client might give you a good deal of the information which you require.

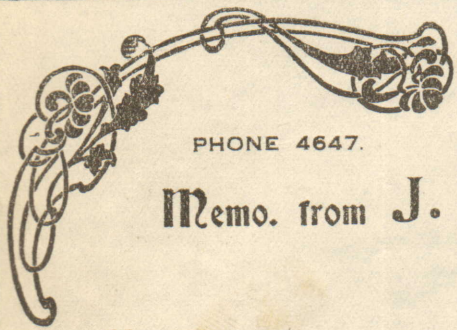

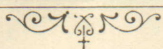

Under these circumstances I shall be glad to hear from you if there is any possibility of proofs being submitted showing the stock in hand at the time of loss. Otherwise the claim will go before the Committee unsubstantiated.

Referring to previous correspondence and interviews as to the claim of our client Mrs Hayes we have ascertained that she is about 7 years in business and as she looked after the business herself and always paid cash for goods, she kept no books. She was not dependant upon the shop and any money made in same was put into stock as her husband was in good employment and his wages was used for the support of himself and his wife. When starting business our client had a sum of £80 which was spent in the purchase of stock. We personally can certify that on the death of our client's mother over 12 months ago she received a sum of about £20, she informs us that this sum was spent also in the purchase of stock. We would be obliged if you would look into the claim and let us know if there is any further information which you think we can supply. We are anxious to have the claim disposed of as quickly as possible.
