In reply to your circular letter just received, we enclose herewith duplicate copies of our Claim for goods taken by the Military, as we are informed, and looted from our Warehouse in St. Strand Street, during the recent riots.

We also attach certificates from the two men in charge of these goods.

We have not filled up the Column "Value of Salvage", as practically all the goods claimed for were actually removed or stolen; any remnants that remained were more or less valuable seeds, which were all mixed up, and quite useless.

We also enclose original Fire Policy in the Norwich Union Co. together with the last Premium receipt. ^{10.6585539}

got what Potatoes, etc. they required, and left the premises again
without making any provision for keeping the public out, with the
result of course, that considerable damage was done by the looters.


