

Dear Sir,

We are sorry to trouble you again in this matter, and have to thank you for your reply of the 30th inst. Under the head of workmen's tools there were five claims sent in amounting in the aggregate to £65. one of them being for a set estimated at £25. and the other a claim of four other workmen at £10. each. Would it be possible to sub-divide these as our client wants to know how much he is to hand to each of the five workmen involved in respect of their

loss, and unless he knows this it is impossible to expect him to act as Assessor. We note that the Corporation Metres have been allowed for in full. With regard to the items of goods settled for by Claimant direct to Customers, and in respect of which £9. was allowed under claim 5169, if you will refer to our letter of the 25th inst. we sent you a list of these with the numbers of the various claims which have been already furnished amounting to £34. 3. 0, and we hope it is quite clear that we have no notification of any award of those claims as yet, and they are over and above the £9. awarded under the head of 5619.



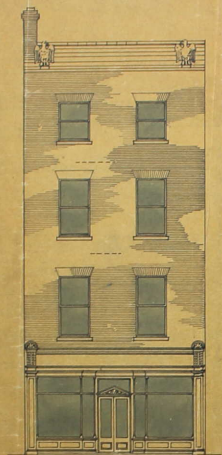

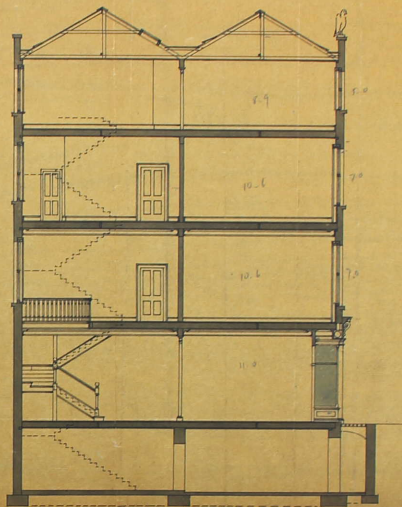
Plans, Section & Elevation

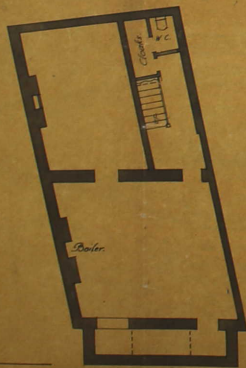

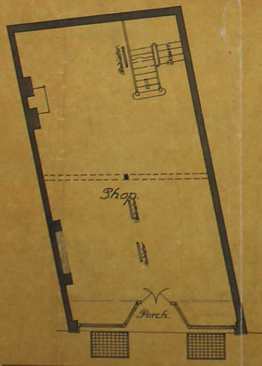
Front Elevation.



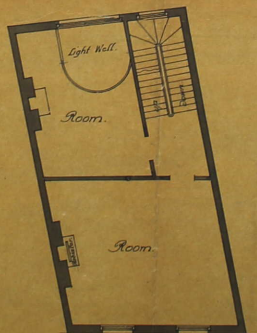
Longitudinal Section.



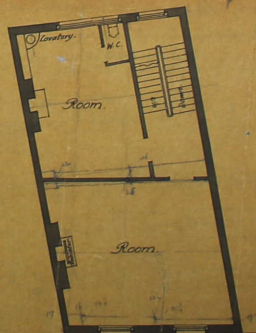
Basement Plan.



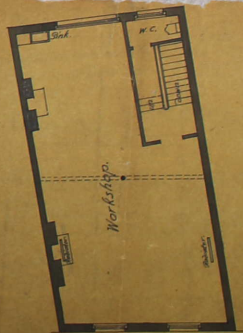
Ground Floor Plan.
