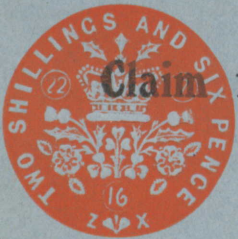

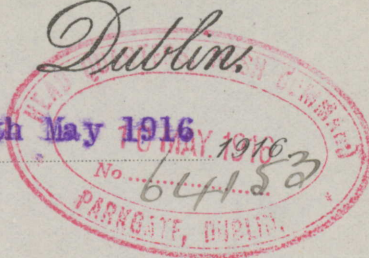

Sir,

We are instructed by Miss Moore and Mr Michael Moore of No. 1 North Brunswick Street to state that possession was taken of their premises 1, 2, & 3 North Brunswick Street and 112 & 113 Church Street on Monday the 24th of April 1916 that possession was at first refused and that the door was broken and a shot fired into the Door and Mr Michael Moore was wounded and was the first wounded person brought into the Richmond Hospital in connection with the Riots. Mr Moore and Miss Moore were ordered out of the house and the House taken possession of by the Sinn Feiners. Mr Moore having been carried into the Hospital Miss Moore made her way to the North Circular Road where she remained for three or four days without been able to get back to her premises. When she returned she found her place had been looted and her clothing and the clothing of Mr Michael Moore gone and some Jewellery belonging to herself. The Furniture had been used as Barricades and had been smashed and injured and her loss in this respect amounts to at least £50.

As to the premises holes were bored through the Walls and the whole premises wrecked and the damage she estimates in this respect to be up to £100

We beg respectfully to put this claim before the Authorities and trust it will meet with consideration.
