a balance of £357. 14. 2 & I only got
a cheque for £100 for goods & a cheque
for £100 for damage down to the house
without counting any other items there
was over £100 worth of sea gone
& the builders estimate for £73. 0. 0
wouldnt cover the damage down to
the house. The only portion I have got
done yet is the roof & the walls built
up where the Rebels cut through from
Jacob to me - them two items alone
cost nearly £40 the roof was left
in an awful state where a lot of men
tramping on it with their rifles & me
(over)

over the parapets of the walls.

The remainder of the damage remains there for any of the Committee that like to come to see it the windows all broken out glass & sashes doors ^{all} taken off the hinges & damaged the chimney breasts - all cut away gables & chimney pieces cut away & all gone completely.

There is a room remains to be seen full of sacks of broken bricks that was cut away from the chimney breasts to get them even removed & cleared away out of the place would cost a large sum in itself. If the Committee call here they can see the state the house was left in & I under estimated my claim if anything a good many times I did not include at all for instance I didn't include the keeping of myself & my assistant when I was out of my house I also had to pay my assistant for the time & my servant & porter also had to be paid. Hoping the matter will be considered again.

In reply to your favour of the 3rd inst I have examined the premises, And find the damages done to your premises are of a serious nature, Owing to the chimney breasts being entirely out away in places, Mantles and fire-grates taken away the arches out and the (5) flues all broken into one space,

To make good the damage I propose to remove the defective brick-work and re-build in with firebrick and cement gauged Mortar Supply and fix in new grates & mantles similar to the old ones to build up the openings in the walls and plaster same to match the existing work, Roof and gutters repaired where damaged by the Men walking & firing from same

The Doors (8) and frames repaired and replaced where too much damaged to be repaired. Windows (5) re-glazed and those which are broken replaced with new sashes & frames, All new wood work will get (3) coats of best oil paint and all plaster inside finished white and the entire work carried out to your entire satisfaction and also to the requirements of the Dublin Corporation Sanitary Authorities
