Dear Sirs,

In reply to your letter of the 9th instant, I am directed by the Property Losses Committee to say that in July last on receipt of the notification of loss in your case from Messrs Hopkins & Hopkins, a form of claim for completion and return to this office was sent to you. As the claim had not been lodged an intimation was addressed to you on 23rd November, 1916, that if not sent in within a week the matter could not be dealt with by the Committee. As nothing further was heard of the matter it was assumed that the claim had been abandoned, and it was so marked in our books.

As the Committee's work is almost at an end, they regret that they are unable now to deal with the matter.
