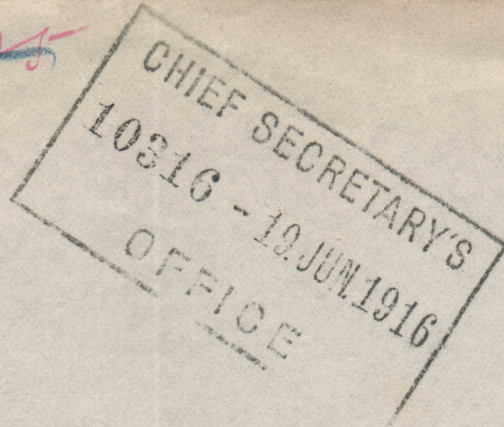

EXTRACT FROM ORDER OF 21st SEPT., '04 (12,918-04).
