The total cash outlay for the articles amounted to 24/6.

No 1. was a present and claimant contends that £250 would not replace them. They were all originals and would, he maintains, have become very valuable in course of time. One drawing was of leavee; he would much prefer the articles than the money. Fagan, I learned, was an amateur with great gifts. I suggested that as an amateur his paintings would not be of any great value in the market. I think it would be advisable to refer the question to someone better qualified to know than I am.

No 2/4. His own compiling went back to 1860 and occupied him many years. It appeared weekly in "Sin Féin" now suppressed.
