Claim of William Kavanagh, 4 North King Street

Mr. Kavanagh carries on a poultry business in the markets and resided with his mother and father and young brothers in three rooms at this address.

His young brother Charles died from gunshot wound received while foolishly desiring to attend a cinematograph at the Rotunda for which a lady gave him a ticket. He died in Children's hospital, Temple Street, 28th April 1916

Claimant left his home on Saturday evening the 29th April at about six oclock to arrange for his brother's interment.

Claimant is a poultry dealer and keeps his cash in his home. He keeps no bank account. On his leaving he left over £45 in cash and notes in a cash box (locked), the cash being enclosed in a wooden box, also locked in the top ^{front} ~~back~~ room, his bedroom. He also left in his bedroom a diamond pin value £4. and a gold pearl breast pin (a present) value £5.

Claimant returned on Sunday at about 11 oc. and after great difficulty eventually was allowed into his home accompanied by soldiers who went over the house with him. He found his box and cash box broken open and all cash gone save a parcel of silver containing £2-12-0. He also found his two pins gone and locks of all chests and drawers and so forth forced open and destroyed.

He pointed out the loss and damage to the military. During claimant's absence his parents were removed, and on being removed his mother stated to the Officer that there was money in the house and the Officer undertook it would be safe.


