Sir,

With reference to Mr. Hooker's claim, when I arrived in Fleet Street, I found several provisions ^{shops} had been nearly emptied by looters. The consequence was that many people were nearly starving while others were taking more than they could consume.

I stopped the looting at once and ordered the people back to their houses & with the help of some men I searched the houses for loot, which I collected as far as possible & distributed fairly.

Most of the food distributed had already been looted, but when that ran out I took more from the store.

The people were starving & something had to be done.

Repeated representations were made from Trinity College to Dublin Castle, but ~~no~~ no definite answer was obtained as to action to be taken in the matter.

I reported my action to the Staff Officer Trinity College.

I do not recognise the items on Mr. Hooker's claim. The only provisions, which were distributed were about 30 bags flake & 4 1/2 S. R. Flour

Most of the rest of the provisions were
bacon & butter, which had already
been looted.

None of the other items on the list
were distributed by me & must have
been looted before my arrival.
