Sir, With reference to hi Hooke's claim , When I arrived in fleet street , I found everal provisions, had been nearly emptied by looters. The consequence was that many people were rearly starving While others were taking more than they Could consume. Istopped the looting at once and ordered the people back to their houses I with the help of some men searched the houses for loot, which collected as for as possible & distributed fairly. most of the food distributed had already been looted, but when that ran out I took more from the store. The people were starring & Something had to be done. Repeated representations were made form Trinity College to Dublin Castle , but an no definite answer was obtained as to Jepaked myachion to the Shaff Officer Trinily College. I do not recognise the items on hi" Hookes claim. The only provisions, which were distributed was about 30 bags flake + 4 4s S. R. Flows

Most of the rest of the provisions were bacon r butter, which had already been looted. hove of the other items on the list were distributed by me must have been looted before my arrival Jam, Jui, You obedich Rurant HElesten It. 17 Lances

He is informed that the goods were taken between the 26th April and 1st May and that the unit supervising was the 8th Cavalry Reserve.
