Bullets entered two bedrooms on the third floor at the rear of Claimant's house, presumably from volleys fired from the Military at Baggot Street Bridge, Sunday, 30th April, 9.30.a.m. In one room there are four bullet holes which went through a lath and plaster wall into the second bedroom. Four panes of glass - one frosted - in bathroom where there is also a bullet hole - require to be replaced, but the damage to bedrooms and bathroom is not serious. £3. should repair building. The claim for furniture £1. 10. 0. is eminently fair. The mirror of the dressing-table was badly smashed by bullets and the wardrobe was damaged before the bullets entered the lath and plaster wall separating the bedrooms.
