



## PARTICULARS OF CLAIM

- OF -

M.SYDNEY ORR practising as STEWART & ORR late of Nos 43 & 44 Lr Sackville Street but now of No.7 Great Brunswick St. Dublin.

I held my late offices at 43 & 44 Lr Sackville St Dublin comprising the entire of the 1st flat of the new Buildings situate at the corner of Lr Sackville Street and Middle Abbey Street Dublin known as "Manfield Chambers" including Electric light in the Hall and on the staircase leading thereto, and a fire proof Strong room in the basement, on Lease for a term of 21 years (about 3 years expired) at the reduced yearly rent of £76 free of taxes. I had the option of renewing the Lease for a further term of ten years at an increased rent of £100 a year free of taxes. The offices were approached by a Bold and handsome Hall door entrance with a massive doubled sided Oak Hall door and a heavy solid oak staircase.

The true letting value of these offices was from £120 to £130 per anhum,

The Lease of said offices at the reduced rent referred to was granted to me by Messrs Manfield & Son in consideration of the giving up of a former

Jax.

Lease which I held of 4 offices in the house No. 43 Lr Sackville Street previous to the rebuilding and of allowing Messrs Manfield to rebuild during my occupation and of submitting to great inconvenience, dislocation and disturbance in my business for a period of about two years during the time the new premises 43 & 44 Lower Sackville St were being built. A Strike took place during the building operations which caused considerable delay.

I claim for the loss of these new offices and disturbance by reason of their destruction.
