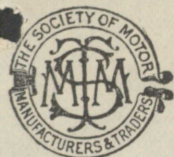

810 x 90 Dunlop Grooved Cover.	£3. 11. 0.
810 x 90 Dunlop Tube.	17. 6.
New front wing complete with inside shield and stays finished and painted to match Car.	3. 1. 6.
Rotax brass Acetylene projector.	3. 6. 9.
Rotax brass side oil lamps.	2. 14. 9. per (pair)
Rotax brass oil tail lamp.	1. 3. 9.

In regard to the radiator, to make a proper job of this it would be necessary to dismantle same and supply and fit an entire new block of tubes, the approximate charge for which would be £15.

The price mentioned above for front wing does not include fitting to car, but the price quoted for repairs to radiator includes detaching same from car and refitting on completion.
