Claimant is a retired Indian merchant, and pending removal from his house in Lansdowne Road to his present address Riverside, Sandymount, he was living in the Metropole Hotel. The articles claimed for were stored in Messrs. Gaynor's (Cork Manufacturers). The other portion of his furniture was stored in Messrs. Millar & Beatty's. I have gone through the various articles of claim and the items have been substantiated, with the exception of the Indian Tiles and two Port-manteaux which Claimant states were of Cawnpore solid leather and cost £15. He states he has only claimed the actual value of the Indian Tiles. He appears to be a wealthy man, and I have not the slightest doubt that his statements are quite accurate. Hearing that motor tyres were increasing in price he purchased four new ones at a cost of £7. 10. 0. apiece a couple of months before the property was burnt out. I believe £60 would just about compensate him.
