I have gone carefully into the circumstances of this claim. I have not seen the Applicant but I have interviewed his twin brother, who is also a respectable employe at the Land Registry. The Claimant, who interests in the buildings

was originally in the army - where he is now for the duration of the war - was a musician and was attached to the Orchestra of the Tivoli Theatre. He was staying in his brother's apartments at the Courts at the time of the rebellion, and his property was stolen either by the rebels who were in possession for several days or the Military subsequently. No allowance was made in the claim for depreciation of the Musical Instruments, which had been in use for 5 years. No insurance.
