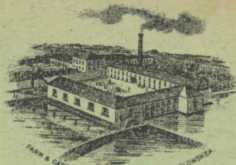
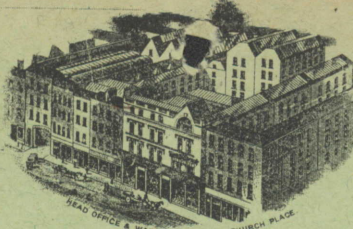

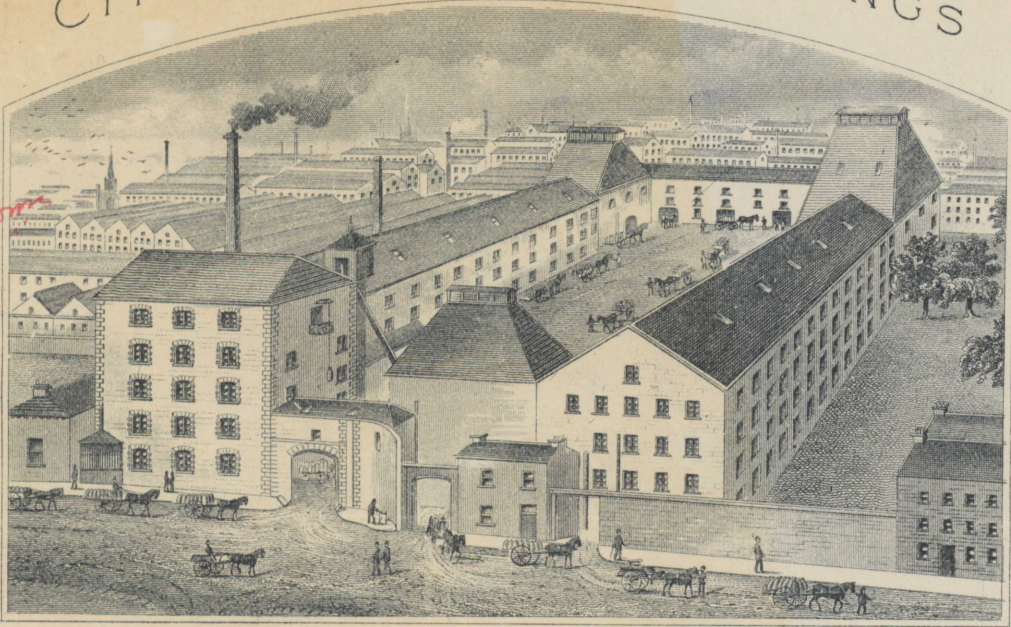

## Bought of Francis J. Usher

Terms:-

1916.

April 24. To Damage by Armed Sinn Feiners in breaking all windows in our No 2 Malt House at City of Dublin Maltings Blackpitts .

The explanation given for such wantonness, was, they should obey orders. The glass was broken out, with rifles to afford clear vision for the Battle expected at Blackpitts within two days, they would win, and we would be Compensated. —

300 to 400 armed men, possessed our premises, they held 6 City Policemen prisoners, of war for 5 hours, afterwards they marched the Policemen away, and later, left the premises completely. —

The above statements were made to the writer at the time.
