As I pointed out to the representative line of your Committee who called on me, I am a poor man, and the violin which was destroyed, was a source of income to me, as I was employed to play at dances in St. Clare's Hall of which I am the caretaker, and at dances all around the District and was always paid for doing so.

I had only the one violin, and since



It was smashed up. I have been unable to replace it, and as I have now no violin I am deprived of the means of earning anything by playing at such entertainments as I have mentioned. Your Committee will therefore plainly see that it will be a great hardship on me if I am not compensated for the loss which I have sustained.

In the circumstances, you will, I am sure, be pleased to bring the matter again before your Committee, and I am confident that they will see their way to reconsider their decision. Thanking you in anticipation of an early reply.
