Referring to our report dated 30th August last upon this claim, we have since received a detailed estimate of cost of reconstruction amounting to £1939.0.7. There are some items of which we had no knowledge when estimating the loss previously, and we could get no particulars until late in October.

Mrs Dillon has now obtained an estimate from Mr Bergan, Architect. We have reconsidered the bill and in view of what we find, we are disposed to put the loss at £992 as per enclosed report which might be put in substitution of our report of 30th August.
