I have investigated this claim and have interviewed Mr. Kilbey. The hotel was occupied on Easter Monday by rebels and everybody in the building was ordered to leave. The claim for the "Old French Barometer" presents interests in the buildings

some points of difficulty. I attach a letter from Yeates & Son, Ltd., which speaks for itself. I do not attach too much importance to this document. Yeates or any other firm might conceivably say that the article in question could not be replaced for £500., but the Committee in my opinion cannot be expected to accept and pay on these valuations. The sum of £10. would purchase a most excellent instrument and if an ex gratia payment of this amount were made, the Committee I think would be generous. Mr. Kilbey had no private insurance, but reference will have to be made to the policy attached to the Hotel claim (425 presumably) in order to ascertain what amount is insured in respect of the property of the staff.

Payment recommended £30.
