



Interests in the buildings

I examined this house which is let out in offices. Practically every window in it had to be replaced. There were no details supplied, so I called on Messrs. Guinness, Mahon & Co., at 16, College Green, who are the Agents for Claimant. I went into the different estimates supplied by Messrs. Lidwell, Builders, for £22. 10. 0., together with a further estimate of repairs by Brennan, £2. 10. 0., and damage to roof £5. Some of the work carried out was not I consider essential, and therefore I could not pass some of the items. After making the necessary deductions I think £25. should compensate.

The title of the property is somewhat involved so that remittance should be sent to Messrs. Guinness, Mahon, who are the responsible parties for the carrying out of the repairs.
