Dear Sir, Referring to yours of the 26<sup>th</sup> I regret to say that all details of my stock in trade and all my books and vouchers were destroyed in the fire. I usually carried from £2000 to £2250 of stock and my existing policy of Insurance was for £2000. My policy previous used to be (up to year 1910) for £3000 for stock.

A I now find that my claim omitted the 2 months rent for which my Solicitor informs me I am liable to the landlord coming to 16<sup>th</sup> June 1916 when my lease expired and I desire that same amounting to £35 be added to my claim. B.

I am expecting that compensation will be made to me for my loss of profits during the period of rebuilding.

My yearly profits averaged about £750.

Gentlemen,

In re to your inquiry re the cost of electric lighting wiring destroyed by fire in your late premises, North Earl Street, Dublin, we beg to say that the amount according to our ledgers paid for by you for new electric lighting works erected by us amounts to £18-13-11.

Of course, to get the same amount of work done now it would cost at least 33-1/3 per cent more in consequence of the war; that would make this amount £24-18-7. This only represent the electric work done by us and does not include for any electric work which you may have got done by any other firm, but this we have no knowledge of, and we only mention here in case you have got any done.

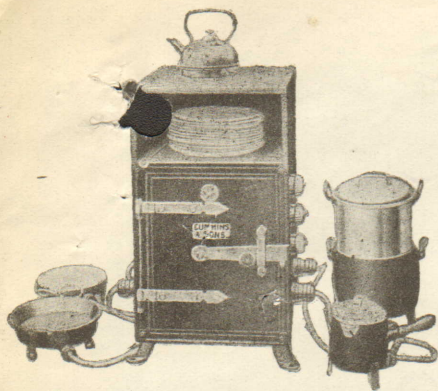

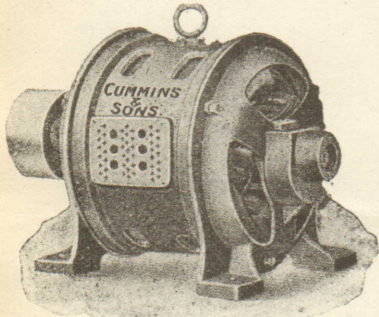

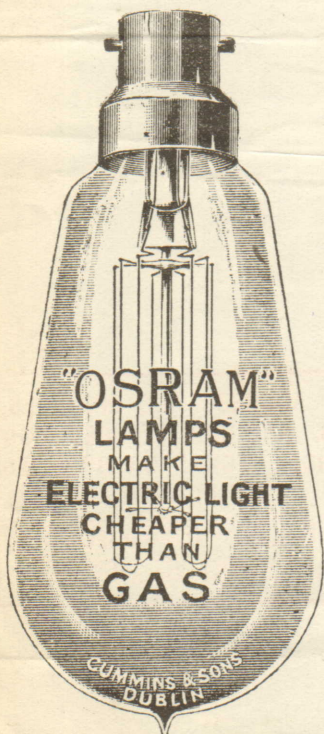
