Pim Bros. some seven years ago, the cost price being £32. 4. 7. and Claimant states these were very little worn. The dressing case was a wedding present and the value is only guessed at. Previous to my interview with Claimant I inquired from Mr. Henry Grandy and showed him the claim. From his knowledge of Claimant he would not doubt its accuracy. However I believe that £23. is about the extent of her loss.
