

Interests in the buildings

These premises were occupied by the Royal Dublin Fusiliers (5th Batt) and subsequently by 8th Hussars-apparently from 25th April to 1st May. In putting down my figures the Committee may think I was somewhat harsh, but I believe that Claimant would be amply compensated for the actual damage at £32. When claim was first made to the Military Authorities in July - more than two months after the Rebellion - the total claim was only £61. 8. 0. of which £35. 8.0 the total claim was only £61. 8. 0. of which £35. 8.0. was for Consequential Loss, and apart from this, had his claim been passed in full he would have been entitled to only £26. In August a detailed estimate was made cut by a Claim Assessor, and he claims for practically all new articles of furniture, painting and repapering property not damaged by the Troops.

In my valuation I have allowed him more than the original estimates affixed to the claim for furniture Award of Committee: Contents and building. In the Stock item - Cigarettes, &c. £4. Claimant has named retail prices, whereas he is only entitled to wholesale.


