We beg to inform you that we act as Agents for the Ensor Estate, Owners of the premises No 32 Merrion Square, and we find from a inspection of the house that considerable damage was done to it by, we understand, the Military Authorities during the recent riots. The roofs were occupied by the soldiers who evidently used them as a point of vantage to fire from. The estimated amount of the damage is £5, and we think it well to let you have a note of the amount of this claim at the earliest available moment.
