



There is no evidence Remarks to prove that any one was on the roof during the Rebellion but I have no doubt that the concussion caused by the gun fire loosened some of the slates as the late tenants who at the time had not vacated the premises informed me that the roof was undoubtedly in a worse state after the Rebellion that before. I am of the opinion that £5. would be a fair contribution and accordingly recommend payment of this amount. Signature
