

I have investigated this claim and have seen the applicant at her stall at Westland Row. The rebels had possession of the Station premises and most of the stock in the stall was looted, together with the articles Interests in the buildings

mentioned above. The claimant usually had special attire for wearing at her business and this and her bracelet were missing when she was able to get back to her stall. I am satisfied that the claim may be admitted. There is a separate claim (No. 4190) in respect of Stock-in-trade.
