Dear Sir,

Referring to yours of the 28th Oct., and your previous correspondence, I thought that you required particulars of each item of my claim (48a) and, as the items are of a very miscellaneous character, you can readily understand the delay (since all my books correspondence & receipts were destroyed in the recent fire) in getting information from the various firms that I happened to have had dealings with, & particularly so because they have all been cash transactions, except in one or two cases. Some of the smaller items, it is impossible for me to trace the origin of purchase. But of the heavier items, so far as memory is concerned, I can explain. I have numbered, consecutively in red ink the items on the claim herewith returned with the object, in my following explanation, of referring to the numbers ^{for} the items ^{for} conciseness sake.

- Item no 1. cannot remember date or place of purchase
- 2, Do. Both were in a good state of preservation
- 3, Had two of these trunks; one so far as I remember, purchased in England, the other a present made me, which was lost I cannot exactly say.
- 4 My tailors were Messrs Wright & Co of Sackville St., Fallon & Co, Mary St, Brown Bachelors Walk, Collins's Middle Abbey St. Where, in particular, the suits were bought I cannot say, but one of them was certainly from Fallon's. The prices ranged from £2/15/- to £3/15/-, & I entered an average of £3 a suit.
- 5 Purchased for Cash in a firm next Downes in Talbot St, (now destroyed), the name of which I cannot remember, but I think it was Forsyth's or Hipp's.
- 6 cannot remember where purchased
- 7 Purchased from the India-Rubber Co Ltd. 15 St Andrews St.
- 9 cannot remember places or dates of purchase
- 0-163 cannot remember places or dates of purchase but can if necessary prove through members of the club that I held same.
- 17 cannot recollect date or place of purchase Have had the dress-suit for some few years, but it was in a good state of preservation.

14, 15, 16, 18, 19, 21, 22, 23, 24, } cannot possibly

Drewen & Ryan Sackville St, Hyam & Co Dame St
