MEMORANDUM.

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Swine Fever was found to exist on these premises on 25th March when they were placed under restrictions. There were originally 11 swine. Between 24th March and 6th April, 1916, 2 of these died and 5 were slaughtered by the Department, for the latter the owner was compensated. All these animals were found affected with swine Fever. This left 4 pigs remaining. On 22nd May Mrs. Caffrey reported to the police at Bridewell that one of these remaining pigs was sick. On the following day a Veterinary Inspector of the Department visited and found the animal dead. The carcass was subsequently removed to O'Keeffes (knackers). Post Mortem examination in this instance did not reveal lesions of Swine Fever. Mrs. Caffrey's remaining 3 pigs were subsequently removed on licence for slaughter. Restrictions were finally removed from her premises on 8th July.



I have been appointed by the Treasury to assess losses arising out of the recent rebellion. The above claim was handed to me for assessment, and contained an item of £8. for a hog which, the Claimant alleged, had died of starvation during the rebellion. I, however, learned that the hog did not die until the 25th May, a month after the occurrence, and was destroyed by Messrs. O'Keefe in accordance with an order received from Mr. Thompson, one of your Veterinary Surgeons. From information received it has been suggested that it was a suspected case of swine fever. To enable me to complete my report perhaps you would be good enough to kindly advise me what the animal was suffering from, and, at the same time perhaps you would kindly state whether the Department allowed any compensation.
