Referring to your communication of 5th inst., stating that the Committee are unable to admit the claim made in this I have seen Mrs Coughlan and she has requested me to write you again on the subject.

I cannot conceive on what grounds your Committee decline to admit this claim. The Currency Notes were "Property" within the meaning of the reference to the Committee, just as much as furniture is property.

This property was stolen by the soldiers while in possession of this woman's room.

She has a son fighting in the Navy. He took part in the Jutland Battle and was home wounded. He has now returned to his post.

I protest against the decision of your Committee not to recognise this claim. I shall ask your Committee to re-
