

I am of the opinion this is a very inflated claim and as Mr Duffy is now residing in England it is a very difficult one to assess. He is claiming the alledged cost price of each article, and it was with difficulty that I induced him to give an approximate date of the purchase of the various articles which you will observe he states practically all bought this yeasignature. The cottage in which he resided is a small one at the rere of Henry St so I do not believe for a moment that he had all the articles mentioned. I recommend payment of £10.

I am in receipt of your letter of the 5th inst., and note your remarks, and in reply would mention that I fail to conceive how you can remember the price you paid for the 100 articles filled in on and list sent you by me, you are unable to tell me when you bought them. I would also draw your attention to the fact that your original claim was not signed until the 8th July (nine weeks after the Rebellion) in the interval you should have been able to arrive at the correct amount of your claim. As only original claims will be recognised I would ask you to give me the approximate date in which on which the articles on accompanying list were purchased — on receipt of this information the matter will have my attention. At the same time you might let me know how many persons were living in your house 10 Henry Place at the time of the Rebellion.

I am surprised that you are unable to state the date on which the various articles were purchased, in view of the fact that you are able to give the cost price in each case, and, as the total amount claimed is only 6d. less than the amount paid for the numerous articles they all must doubtless be of a very recent purchase. I must accordingly request you to give me an approximate date.

I asked you in my previous letter to give me detailed statement of the $l\frac{1}{2}$ dozen underwear. You have failed to do this and I must again draw your attention to the fact that I cannot proceed with the case until I have this information before me.

I observe that the total of your claim now amounts to £44: 2: 9. Please state how you reconcile these figures with your claim dated 8th July given as £18: 16: 9% sworn before a Justice of the Peace that same was correct.

I await the favour of your further advices in due course.
