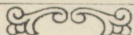
Enquiry made on receipt of Mr McDowell's letter of 25th October (returned herewith) has elicited the fact that this claimant had put in an earlier claim for the same articles but from a different address, and without the aid of a Solicitor. In this claim No. 2669 her name was plainly given as "Bridget Keily" and the claim being reported on by an Inspector, who furnished the correct address, a recommendation for the payment of £10. 5. 0 was made in the Committee's 4th list of recommendations, page 66. This amount has it is understood been paid.

We do not think that there was anything deliberately fraudulent about the second claim which Mrs Keily, who is a respectable widow over 70, presumably signed on the Solicitor's direction not realising she was repeating her former claim, which had not then been paid and of which her Solicitor was not aware. Mr McDowell has been communicated with and has struck the case out of his books as disposed of. The draft (enclosed) may be cancelled, and no further action need be taken on his letter.

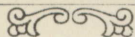

Sir, With reference to Claim No 4308 - Mrs Bridget Kelly - which has been Reported on by Committee 30⁹/₁₆, with a recommendation for £20, I have made all the necessary enquiries, in the vicinity of No 1 Colles Lane Dublin (burnt out), and have ascertained that no person of the name of "Kelly" resided there, but that a Mrs Bridget "Kierly" was in occupation at the happening of the Rebellion. Under Claim No 2669, she has already been awarded £10.5/-, in full settlement, in accordance with the Committee's Report thereon of the 25⁸/₁₆.

I have drawn Mr. McDowell's attention to the fact that two claims were made, in respect of the identical loss - he being the Solicitor having the Carriage of the claim - and he is satisfied that, in the circumstances,

In justice to Mr. McDowall, I would like to add that he was quite unaware that Mrs. Bright-Kirby had already claimed, under N^o 2669, when he deputed his clerk to interview her, relative to a fresh claim, and, by a slip on the latter's part, the name "Kirby" would appear to have crept into the second document. On the other hand, it can be pleaded for Mrs. Kirby that, owing to her advanced years, she, presumably, overlooked the true import of the second claim form, when called upon to complete it.
