letter, I am threatened with  
a writ if you do not stay  
there hand I shall be  
homeless as I could not  
pay any rent since rebellion

I was Anne Mackey  
I have suffered from the  
late rebellion through  
fire and looting and  
almost lost my life only  
for my son who saw the  
fire and saved the best  
part of the house, Mr  
Kevin O Duffy Dentists of  
Harcourt St gave both  
myself and 2 children  
shelter and entertainment  
for a week, I was in  
the midst of the danger  
directly opposite Sinn Fein  
bank and Stephen Green  
corner



my claim is a small  
one <sup>\$ 30</sup> 7-12-6 he never even  
looked at it he suppressed  
it, before he is entrusted  
with any more money  
there ought to be an enquiry,  
he is only studying his  
own friends not the  
people who are in urgent  
need through his passing  
me over and also wasting  
my time my landlord has  
got a decree against me  
for rent that has run up  
since rebellion. Mr O'Keely  
1 Marine Terrace Bray is  
my landlords name  
Please stay his hand for  
the present I have a  
Widow for over 30 years  
and never got a Penny  
Charity from Church or State

I am less than a week  
home when for the want  
of the broken doors not  
been boarded up by the  
agent Mr Latimer of Fleet St.  
I was robbed of my  
fruit my way of living  
my clothes both electric and  
gas slots broken open and  
electric wires all burnt  
I am practically penniless  
myself and my son have  
lost a week at the  
mansion house trying to  
get immediate relief in cash  
to carry on my business  
during my time there I  
found things carried on  
very unfair he has his  
own crowd round him  
that he expects will vote  
for him next year
