I have very carefully investigated the circumstances of this claim & have interviewed Mr. Mason. The damage was caused by the military on the date mentioned by a bomb thrown at the interests in the buildings front of the premises. The firm's contractors (Messrs Roberts of Grant Canal St) had a contract on the buildings in hand at the time & they carried out the repairs in my opinion at a reasonable price. The expenses referred to were lost in transit. Everything claimed for has been covered at cost & I beg to recommend that the claim be admitted.
