This man at the time of the insurrection was residing at Wynn's Hotel, which was entirely consumed in the conflagration. I have succeeded in interviewing the Applicant, and took a mental note of his "style" of

Interests in the buildings wardrobe. As a result I am quite satisfied that my valuation very fully covers his loss. I am not in a position to say if the amount of £250. insured on Guests property would cover the total loss of all the Guests that were in the Hotel. Their late Manager is not now in the Company's service, and is at present in the South of Ireland and is not therefore available.

There is a clause in the Policy limiting the amount recoverable by any one Guest to the sum of £30.
