

RE CLAIM OF DERMOT & ANNE KENNEDY.

Referring to your letter herein and also to our interview with you per 'phone on yesterday, we have since ascertained from our clients that the Policy for £400. on their stock, fittings and fixtures was taken away along with the goods from the premises, but we enclose you particulars received from the Royal Insurance Company setting out how the Policy is made up.

In reference to the sum of £50. for fixtures mentioned therein, it is but right to say that this Policy was taken out in 1912 when the claimants started business, and they have considerably added to their fixtures, etc. since, hence the difference between the amount of the claim and the amount covered by Insurance.

As mentioned at our interview on yesterday, it is impossible to get detailed particulars of the stock, but, as we mentioned, we have amongst the papers of our clients evidence that will satisfy your assessor that in January last when taking Counsel's opinion in family matters the stock was returned at £313. 6.11.

If your Assessor should call on us we should be only too pleased to afford him every facility to substantiate our clients' claim.
