RULES OF THE BURBIDGE MEMORIAL LIBRARY.

CLAUSE 1.—The "Burbidge Memorial Library," founded to perpetuate the memory of the late Mr. F. W. Burbidge, M.A., F.L.S., is the property of the Irish Gardeners' Association and Benevolent Society. It shall be housed in the Registered Offices of the Association, and available to the Members only.

CLAUSE 2.—At the request of General Committee, the Association may grant, for the purchase of additional books, or other necessaries for the use of the Library, such portion of the Library Fund as may, from time to time, be deemed expedient.

CLAUSE 3.—All Funds, save such as may be allocated for immediate use by the General Committee, for purposes set forth in Rule 2, shall be invested in the Post Office Savings Bank as the "Burbidge Memorial Library Fund," in the names of the Trustees.

CLAUSE 4.—Application for books will be dealt with according to priority. *Books must be returned within one month from date of Lending.* Members not able to apply personally shall, on written application to the Librarian, be supplied, borrowers paying postage, and shall be responsible for loss or damage to books while in their possession.

CLAUSE 5.—A book shall be kept, in which all applications, with the titles of books borrowed, and the date of return shall be entered, and the name of the borrowers retained.

CLAUSE 6.—All books shall be officially stamped and numbered, volumes presented to the Library being also inscribed with the donors' names and date of donation.

CLAUSE 7.—A copy of the foregoing rules, together with a list of books, shall be furnished to each member of the Irish Gardeners' Association.

The Committee solicit further gifts of suitable books for the Library, and also suggestions from the members, as to useful books to be purchased as means permit.
